WARNING SIGNS AN INDIVIDUAL MAY BE TRAFFICKED:

- → Signs of physical abuse such as burn marks, bruises or cuts
- → Unexplained absences from class; overly tired in class
- → Less appropriately dressed than before; sexualized behavior
- > Withdrawn, depressed, distracted or checked out
- → Brags about making or having lots of money
- → Displays expensive clothes, accessories or shoes
- → New tattoo (tattoos of a name, symbol of money or barcode are often used by pimps as a way to brand victims)
- → Older boyfriend or new friends with a different lifestyle
- → Talks about wild parties or invites other students to attend parties
- → Shows signs of gang affiliation (a preference for specific colors, notebook doodles of gang symbols, etc.)

RAISE YOUR VOICE


Report your concerns to the appropriate authorities.

- → Call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center: 1 (888) 373-7888 ~ Text "HELP" or "INFO"
- → Call 911 to report a citizen concern or complaint; follow up one week later

TRAFFICKERS OFTEN EXHIBIT THESE BEHAVIORS:

- → Jealous, controlling and violent
- → Significantly older than female companions
- → Promise things that seem too good to be true
- → Encourage victims to engage in illegal activities to achieve their goals and dreams
- → Buy expensive gifts or owns expensive items
- → Vague about his/her profession
- → Pushy or demanding about sex
- ightarrow Encourage inappropriate sexual behavior
- \rightarrow Isolate victim and monopolizes perception



QUESTIONS TO ASK

If you can speak with a suspected victim privately and without jeopardizing his or her safety, ask a few questions to gather more information:

- \rightarrow Can you come and go as you please?
- → Have you or your family been hurt or threatened if you tried to leave?
- → Do you live with your employer?
- → Where do you sleep and eat?
- → Are you allowed to keep the money you earn?
- → Do you have your passport/identification? Who has it?
